DECLARATION OF HEADS OF STATE AND GOVERNMENT OF THE ECONOMIC COMMUNITY OF WEST AFRICAN STATES ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ECOWAS COMMON EXTERNAL TARIFF (CET)

WE, THE HEADS OF STATE AND GOVERNMENT OF THE ECONOMIC COMMUNITY OF WEST AFRICAN STATES

MEETING ON THE 15 day of December 2014 in Abuja, Nigeria;

REAFFIRMING the Revised ECOWAS Treaty signed on 24th July, 1993;

MINDFUL of the objective of the Community as enunciated in Article 3 of the Revised ECOWAS Treaty;

MINDFUL of Article 35, 36, and 37 of the said treaty concerning trade liberalization, customs duties and the Common External Tariff within the Community with the view to establishing a community customs union;

RECALLING the adoption of the ECOWAS Common External Tariff (CET) by the 29th session in Niamey, NIGER on 12 January 2006;



RECALLING the adoption of the content of the ECOWAS CET and its accompanying regulations by Council of Ministers at its 70th Ordinary session in June 2013 in Abidjan;

RECALLING the adoption of the Regulation on ECOWAS Supplementary Measures by Council of Ministers and its decision to implement the ECOWAS CET in all member states from 1st January 2015 at its extraordinary session held in September 2003 in Abidjan;

CONSCIOUS of our endorsement of the final structure of the CET and its regulatory measures as well as the implementation date of 1st January 2015 at the extraordinary session held on 25th October 2013 in Dakar;

ENCOURAGED, by all the preparatory activities undertaken by ECOWAS Commission and member states to ensure a harmonious roll-out of the CET in line with the CET Implementation Road map adopted by Directors General of Customs on 14th January 2014 in Ouagadougou;

Fully ASSUMING our leadership to achieve a Customs Union in West Africa;

DO HEREBY;

Commit ourselves to the implementation of the ECOWAS CET from 1st January 2015 and direct the President of the ECOWAS Commission to take all necessary measures to accompany member states to ensure a smooth application of this important regional instrument.

IN FAITH WHEREOF WE, THE HEADS OF STATE AND GOVERNMENT OF THE MEMBER STATES OF THE ECONOMIC COMMUNITY OF WEST AFRICAN STATES (ECOWAS) HAVE SIGNED THIS DECLARATION
