TWENTY-THIRD SESSION OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

LOME, 18 - 21 JUNE 1988

FINAL REPORT

I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Council of Ministers of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) held its Twenty-third session from 18 to 21 June, 1988 in the Banquet Hall of the Headquarters of the Togolese People's Rally in Lome, Togolese Republic.

II. OPENING SESSION

- The Session was declared open by Mr. Komla ALIPUI, Honourable Minister of Economic Affairs and Finance of the Republic of Togo. On behalf of His Excellency, General GNASSINGBE EYADEMA, Founder-Chairman of the Togolese People's Rally, President of the Republic, and on tehalf of the Government and People of Togo, he welcomed honourable delegates and observers. On behalf of his honourable colleagues, he expressed his profound gratitude to Dr. KALU I. KALU, Honourable Minister of Transport of the Federal Republic of Nigeria who over the past two years, successfully assumed the Chairmanship of the Council. The Minister drew the attention of Council to the very unfavourable international economic environment which has been worsened by the locust invasion threatening the economies of the sub-region (the speech is attached as an annex to this report).
- 4. In his reply to the speech delivered by the Honourable Minister from Togo, the Honourable Minister of Transport of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Dr. KALU I. KALU, Chairman of the present session of the Council of Ministers, on his own behalf and on behalf of his colleagues thanked his Excellency General GNASSINGBE EYADEMA. Founder-Chairman of the Togolesè People's

Rally and President of the Republic and the Government and People of Togo for accepting to host this session of Council. The Chairman of Council drew the attention of members to the very high amount being owed as arrears of contributions to the operational budget of the Executive Secretariat and pointed out that, despite the appeal made in Abuja in 1986 by the Heads of States have still not completely paid up their contributions. He also noted that very little progress has been made by the Community in the implementation of the intra-Community trade liberalisation scheme and the Protocol on Free Movement of Persons. In addition, the Honourable Minister mentioned the interest demonstrated by donor agencies in funding the Economic Recovery Programme, as well as in the take-off of the activities of ECOBANK Transnational. (The text of the Honourable Minister's speech is attached as an appendix to this report).

- V. OUTCOME OF DELIBERATIONS
 - Item 2 : REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY
- 7. The Executive Secretary presented his report. The main outline of the report dealt with Community programmes and highlighted the problems encountered in the implementation of development programmes and projects adopted by the decision-making bodies of the Community. It also identified the requirements necessary to pursue the objectives of the Community and looked into future prospects. The report mentioned in particular the topical issue of the dumping of toxic waste in certain Member States by the industrialised countries.

In the report, the Executive Secretary recommends that Council draft a resolution on this subject for consideration and adoption by the Authority of Heads of State and Government.

- 8. Council took note of the report of the Executive Secretary and congratulated him on the quality of the document.
- 9. Representatives of certain Member States reported on the situation concerning the dumping of industrial waste in their countries without the knowledge of their Governments. They informed Council of measures taken by the competent authorities in their countries to remove the waste.
- 10. Council deplored the dumping of toxic waste in the sub-region. Council therefore proposed that a resolution be drafted for the attention of the Authority of Heads of State and Government, condemning the industrialised countries which indulge in such acts, and making it a criminal offence in Member States for any legal or natural person to participate in negotiations for the dumping of industrial waste in the Community (the draft Resolution is attached as an appendix to this report).

Item 3 : FINANCE EXPERTS' REPORT

- Il. The Chairman presented the report of the Finance Experts'. After deliberations, Council once again expressed concern at the very large amount owed as arrears of contributions despite the appeal made in Abuja in 1986 by the Heads of State and Government and the numerous missions undertaken to Member States by the Executive Secretariat in this regard.
- 12. Council noted that among the countries in arriears only Burkina Faso, had honoured its commitments.

- 13. Council requested the Institutions of the Community to prepare a document on the results of measures taken to recover the arrears and present it to the Authority of Heads of State and Government.
- 14. The Institutions should also provide a global statement showing amounts owed by each Member State in respect of the operational budget of the Executive Secretariat, the capital of the Fund, the Special Fund for Telecommunications and the budget for the construction of the Headquarters of the Institutions for the period 1977 1988.
- 15. In the specific case of late payments to the operational budget of the Executive Secretariat and to the capital of the Fund, Council recommended:
 - that regular payment of contributions be taken into account when allocating statutory posts to Member States and when recruiting professional and other categories of staff.
 - that priority be given to the implementation of projects in Member States which pay their contributions regularly. This measure is to be included among the criteria for the selection of projects.
- 16. Council recalled the provisions of Article 54, paragraph 3 of the Treaty on Member States' contribution which stipulates:

"Where a Member State is in arrears at the end of the financial year in the payment of its contributions for reasons other than those caused by public or natural calamity or exceptional circumstances that gravely affect its economy, such Member States may, by a resolution of the Authority, be suspended from taking part in the activities of the institutions of the Community."

17. On the correction of anomalies and irregularities in the grading of staff, Council requested the Executive Secretariat and the ECOWAS Fund Management to maintain the status quo pending a decision by the Establishment Committee on all irregularities and all anomalies noted in the grading of staff in the Institutions.

Item 4 : REPORTS OF TECHNICAL COMMISSIONS

- i) Industry, Agriculture and Natural Resources Commission
- 22. The report presented by the Chairman of the Commission and the recommendations contained therein were adopted by Council.
- 23. Council therefore approved the findings of the feasibility studies on the Community selected cattle breeding centres at Marahoue (Cote d'Ivoire), Madina-Diassa (Mali) and in the Gambia, as well as the studies on selected seed production centres in Zaria (Nigeria), Bouake (Cote d'Ivoire), Molodo (Mali) and Rokupr (Sierra Leone).
- 24. The Council of Ministers directed the Executive Secretariat and the Managing Director of the Fund to take the necessary measures for the execution of these projects.
 - ii) Trade, Customs, Immigration, Money and Payments
 Commission
- 25. The report was presented by the Chairman of the Commission. Council discussed it globally, and subsequently adopted the report with the proposals and recommendations contained therein. In addition, Council made certain observations and took specific decisions as follows:
 - a) In order to update the country percentages to be used to determine the annual contribution of Member States to the budgets of the Community, the Executive Secretariat was directed to refer to the most recent figures published by the United Nations system. The Secretariat was also requested to carry out a study based on the analysis of trends in the economic situation of Member States over a three-year period.

This analysis should not however give rise to a review of the provisions of the Protocol on this subject.

Pending the updating of the country percentages used in determining the annual contributions of Member States to the budgets of the Community, all Member States are to comply with the present provisions.

Trade and customs cooperation issues remain the cornerstone of the Community. All Member States are therefore requested to take all necessary measures at national level, without delay, to ensure the speedy implementation of Acts and Decisions on the trade liberalisation of unprocessed goods and traditional handicraft products using the customs and statistical documents on this subject adopted by the relevant authorities of ECOWAS.

In the case of trade in industrial products, Member States and the Executive Secretariat should continue to coordinate their efforts at ensuring that the remaining conditions are fulfilled before the effective take-off of the trade liberalisation scheme for industrial products as from 1 January 1990. In particular, Member States are urged to take the necessary legal and administrative measures at national level before this date to ensure that the decisions are implemented and notify the Executive Secretariat accordingly. At the appropriate time, Council will thus be able to submit to the Authority of Heads of State and Government the draft decision amending the new date of effective take off of the simultaneous implementation of the scheme by all Member States.

In addition, Member States should forward the new applications to the Executive Secretariat, no later than the agreed deadline of 31 August 1988.

The draft compensation budget can then be finalised for adoption by the November 1988 budget session of Council.

c) Considering that the free movement of goods and persons is the foundation upon which the Community should be built and, in view of the problems faced by economic operators and other road users moving from the territory of one Member State to another, Council mandated the Executive Secretariat to convene a meeting of Ministers of Internal Affairs and of State Security, to seek adequate solutions to the problems reported in the implementation of the Protocol on Free Movement of Persons, the Right of Residence and Establishment.

Prior to the ministerial meeting, a meeting of national officers responsible for emigration, immigration and cross-border issues should be held to consider the problems encountered and the obstacles identified in the implementation of the Protocol with a view to proposing solutions and making recommendations.

- iii) Transport, Communications and Energy Commission
- 26. After presentation of all documents of the Commission, Council noted that a number of Member States had not had enough time to confer with the institutions and bodies responsible for the implementation and follow-up of recommendations in their countries.
- 27. Council also noted that some of the recommendations of the Commission needed to be re-examined and rendered clearer and more concise.

- 28. The Executive Secretariat was requested to classify the recommendations according to the various transport modes land, maritime and air in order to facilitate consideration of such recommendations. It is however understood that the Executive Secretariat will prepare a note on the feasibility of these recommendations, in the light of available resources, and of priorities to be determined later.
- 29. Following these observations, Council decided to reconsider all documents of the Commission at its next session in November 1988.
 - Item 5: Memorandum on the status of Ratification of Protocols and Conventions deposited at the Executive Secretariat
- 30. The progress report on the status of ratification of Protocols and Conventions signed by the Authority of Heads of State and Government was presented by the Executive Secretariat.
- 31. Council took note of this report and urged Member States to speed up the process of ratification of all those Protocols and Conventions that are yet to be ratified.
- 32. Member States were also urged to make every effort to forward the Instruments of Ratification to the Executive Secretariat as soon as ratifications are effected.
 - Item 6: Report of the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee
 on the Construction of the Headquarters of
 the Community Institutions (Executive Secretariat
 and Fund)
- 33. The Council of Ministers considered the report of the Ad Hoc Committee on the construction of the Community Headquarters and recommended that the Authority of Heads

of State and Government mandate the Fund Management to undertake additional works in respect of the ECOWAS Fund headquarters building, at a cost of 81,912,475 FCFA, made up as follows: -

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- 34. These extra works are necessary in part, to improve security and conform to the international technical standards for buildings such as the Fund Headquarters.
- 35. The total revised cost of the ECOWAS Fund Headquarters Project excluding furnishing therefore amounts to five billion eighty-one million nine hundred and twelve thousand four hundred and seventy five (5,081 912 475) FCFA mefore tax. (See attached table)
- 36. Considering that the delays in payment of constributions for financing the construction of the headquarters of the Community may lead to projects cost over-runs, Council recommended to the Authority of Heads of State and Government that an urgent appeal be made to Member States, urging them to fulfil their obligations on this subject. (The statement of payment of contributions is attached as an appendix to this Report).
- 37. Council further recommended that the Heads of State and Government appeal to the Togolese Government to give favourable consideration to the Fund Management's request for a waiver of the service tax on the construction of the Fund Headquarters in Lome.

- 38. With regard to expenditure on meetings of the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee, Council considered that the cost of the meetings, estimated on 2nd April, 1988 at 108 million FCFA in respect of the Fund Headquarters, is included in the 5 billion FCFA vote stipulated in Decision A/DEC.4/7/86 as initially directed by the Authority of Heads of State and Government.
- 39. Council directed that, in future, a detailed progress report on construction works on the Headquarters of the Institutions be submitted to it at each session.

Item 7: REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 40. The Council of Ministers adopted the report of the Board of Directors and the recommendations contained therein.
 - Item 8: EXPIRATION OF THE TERM OF OFFICE OF THE

43. No issues were raised under this item of the agenda.

VI. ADOPTION OF THE REPORT

44. This Report was adopted after amendment.

VII. CLOSING SESSION

45. The Chairman of the present session of Council, Honourable Dr. Kalu Idika Kalu expressed his satisfaction with the results of the meeting. He then expressed the hope that ECOWAS would be able to realise its objectives.

On the recommendation of the Industry, Agriculture and Natural Resources Commission meeting in Lome from 24 - 28 May, 1988.

DECIDES

Article 1

The feasibility reports on the breeding centres at Marahoue Ranch (COTE D'IVOIRE), Madina Diassa Ranch (MALI), and livestock Development Project (THE GAMBIA) for the production of selected breeding stocks of the Bovine species are hereby adopted.

Article 2

The Executive Secretary and the Managing Director of ECOWAS Fund shall be responsible for the mobilisation of financial resources necessary for the establishment of the three selected centres.

Article 3

The Executive Secretariat is mandated to contact Nigerian Government for the proposal of a new site to replece Potta Cattle Ranch.

Article 4

The Executive Secretariat is to undertake feasibility studies in 1989, on the new Centres, simultaneously with the studies on the four centres in Group 2.

THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS,

MINDFUL of Article 6 of the ECOWAS Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and determining its composition and functions,

MINDFUL of Article 6 paragraphs I and 2 of the Protocol relating to the ECOWAS Fund authorising the Council of Ministers to determine the terms and conditions for the paying-up of the capital of the ECOWAS Fund.

MINDFUL of Decision No. A/DEC.6/7/87 of 9 July 1987 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government of ECOWAS relating to the second tranche of the called-up capital of the ECOWAS fund,

MINDFUL of Decision No. DEC.8/7/87 of 9 July 1987 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government of ECOWAS relating to the remaining portion of the authorised capital of the ECOWAS Fund.

CONSCIOUS of the importance of the role of the ECCWAS Fund in the mobilisation of necessary resources for the implementtion of the ECOWAS Economic Recovery Programme,

CONSIDERING Recommendation No. 2/6/88 of the Twenty-First Session of the Board of Directors of the ECOWAS Fund held in Lome from 15 to 17 June 1988 highlighting the need to determine the terms and conditions for the paying-up of the second tranche of the called-up capital and for the callable capital of the ECOWAS Fund,

DECIDES:

ARTICLE I

ECOWAS Member States shall pay up the second tranche of the called-up capital of the ECOWAS Fund in the amount of fifty million United States dollars (US\$50,000,000) within a period of four years.

ARTICLE 2

ECOWAS Member States' contributions to the second tranche of the ECOWAS Fund Capital in the amount of fifty million United States dollars (US\$50,000,000) and for calls in respect of the callable capital in the amount of four hundred million United States dollars (US\$400,000,000) shall be as follows:

Honourable Chairman of the Council of Ministers,
Honourable Ministers
The Executive Secretary of ECOWAS
The Managing Director of the Fund
Honourable Delegates
Distinguished Guests
Ladies and Gentlemen,

Yesterday, we welcomed with enthusiasm the various statutory technical Commissions, the Ad Hoc Committees, the Board of Directors of the Fund and today, we welcome the Council of Ministers, and preparing to welcome with open arms and whole-heartedly the Heads of State and Government of our Community in a few days' time. On this august occassion, the people of Togo, solidly behind their Government and the Founder-Chairman of the Togolese People's Rally and President of the Togolese Republic, General GNASSINGBE EYADEMA, have great pleasure and feel themselves greatly honoured in being called upon to host these meetings of our Community.

How else could it be when this is the organisation which our Heads of State and Government have mandated to translate into reality the aspirations of the peoples of the West

African sub-region to live in an integrated, harmonious and developed Community, in response to a world which is daily becoming more and more ruthless and inaccessible to the basic virtues of solidarity and mutual assistance.

That is why, Honourable Ministers, Distinguished Delegates, Ladies and Gentlemen, I would like, first of all, to perform the pleasant duty assigned to me by the Head of State of the Togolese Republic, General GNASSINGBE EYADEMA: that of extendding to you the most cordial welcome to Lome in the Togolese Republic and to the Headquarters of the Togolese People's Rally, a centre of dialogue, consultation, international co-operation and friendship among peoples.

Honourable Ministers, may I, on your behalf, express our profound gratitude to our colleague from the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Mr. Kalu Idika Kalu, Minister of Transport, who has been Chairman of our Council for two years, carrying out his duties with clear sightedness and competence.

The outcome of the preparatory meetings of our Council will soon be submitted for our consideration. It is our duty to deliberate on it while bearing in mind the international economic environment which has failed to alleviate the constraints of the third world and more particularly those of our continent, and which has worsened the inflexibility of a system which is becoming increasingly unfair and unbearable.

To these must be added the devastating effects of imported inflation and excessive indebtedness.

As if this was not enough, most Member States of our Community now find themselves faced with aggression from another front = the invasion of migratory locusts. Huge swarms of these insects have been reported in Burkina Faso, Cape Verde. Mali, Mauritania and Senegal. Their larvae have been reported elsewhere in large numbers and the invasion is certain to become more widespread after the rainy season in the Sahel.

In the face of this two pronged aggression by both man and nature against our Community, judicious and bold decisions must be taken in order to re-kindle in our peoples, the hope born over ten years ago with the creation of ECOWAS.

Honourable Ministers, fully aware of our responsibilities it gives me great satisfaction to note the presence here today of the majority of those charged with directing the activities of the states of our Community, aimed at achieving better integration of our economies.

Honourable Ministers, I would like our discussions to reflect these fundamental observations and, rather than being a source of discouragement, they should strengthen us in our continuing aspiration towards achieving the necessary integration of ECOWAS. For, as President EYADEMA declared in his closing speech at the 5th Summit of our Community in Lome in 1980. What we should remember is that ours is an irreversible option and that, whatever the difficulties, whatever the obstacles — and these in any case are in the natural order of things — ECOWAS is, and shall remain, the ideal environment within which our people shall achieve the progress necessary for their survival.

OPENING SPEECH BY THE HONOURABLE MINISTER
OF TRANSPORT OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF NIGERIA
AND CHAIRMAN, ECOWAS COUNCIL OF MINISTERS, DR. KALU
I. KALU, AT THE MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS,
HOLDING IN LOME, TOGO
FROM 18TH TO 21ST JUNE, 1988

Honourable Ministers,
The Executive Secretary of ECOWAS,
The Managing Director of the ECOWAS Fund,
Distinguished Delegates,
Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is my special privilege and pleasure to welcome you to the 22nd Session of the Council of Ministers of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) taking place here, in the Togolese capital, Lome. I wish to express my profound gratitude and thanks to His Excellency General Gnassingbe EYADEMA, Founder Chairman of the Togolese People's Rally, President of the Togolese Republic, the Government and people of Togo for hosting us to this round of our meeting and for making excellent facilities available for us. This is a clear demonstration of the sincere commitment of the Government and people of Togo to sub-regional co-operation.

Dear Colleagues,
Distinguished Delegates,

Our meeting is once more called upon to take a hard look at the performance of our organisation within the last six months and to take decisions that will determine its new course of action. It is regrettable to observe that after ten years of the existence of ECOWAS, the sub-region is still grappling with the problem of the construction of the trans-West African Highway, the absence of telecommunication links to our State capitals, the low level of agricultural production resulting in the perennial incidence of food scarcity, famine and hunger the destructive action of migratory locusts and the menage of desert encroachment and erosion.

One may be inclined to ask some pertinent questions as to what extent have the institutions of our Community geared themselves towards addressing these problems? Have the programmes of the Community been well articulated to meet the challenges posed by these problems? How far have we provided the institutions of the Community with the necessary

wherewithal to implement our programmes? These and some other questions should agitate our minds during this session of Council.

I wish to draw the attention of my dear Colleagues to the launching of the ECOWAS Economic Recovery Programme in Abuja in July, 1987. The Economic Recovery Programme is our positive response to tackle the severe crisis of underdevelopment. After a year of its launching, I am happy to report that some progress has been recorded in the implementation of the programme. The African Development Bank (ADB) has granted the ECOWAS Fund a credit line of US \$40 million to finance some of the projects. A donors coordination meeting on regional intergration projects was held in Lome in April 28 to 29, 1988, where invited donors confirmed their interest in the financing of several projects in the transport and telecommunications sectors. The ECOWAS Fund, I am assured, is still continuing its search for external funds to finance other projects which have not yet got confirmed funding as of now. But the Fund's task of mobilising resources for the projects will be facilitated, if member States also adopt short-term economic measures aimed at restructuring their economies. The activities of the Community at the sub-regional level-are designed to complement the economic reform measures undertaken by member states.

Honourable Ministers,

Coming back to the financial position of the ECOWAS Fund, this vital institution of our Community cannot perform wonders if it is starved of funds. The ECOWAS Fund is now facing serious liquidity crunch and unless its resources are augmented soon, the Fund's activities will grind to a halt. I therefore enjoin all of you to see to it that loans received from the Fund for development projects are repaid promptly to enable it give further loans. Member States that are still in arrears in the payment of their first tranche of the Fund's capital should liquidate their arrears.

On a more positive note, I wish to report to you that the ECOBANK Transnational Incorporated, a purely private concern in which the ECOWAS Fund holds 10%

equity interest, has commenced operation by opening its Togo office in Lome. I am informed that similar ECOBANK branch offices will soon be opened in Lagos, Nigeria and Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire. When ECOBANK's operations have expanded in the sub-region it is envisaged that it will assist in no small way in facilitating intra-Community trade as well as mobilising funds for the industrial and economic development of our Community.

Honourable Ministers, Distinguished Delegates,

There are more outstanding problems which the Community should find quick solutions to, namely:

- i) The obstacles to the implementation of the ECOWAS Trade Liberalisation Programme and
- ii) The implementation of the Protocol on Free Movement of Persons, Right of Residence and Establishment.

The development of free flow of trade within the Community is the bedrock of our economic integration efforts. It is in this light that a decision was taken some years ago at the highest possible level, to set up the modalities for the implementation of ECOWAS Trade Liberalisation Scheme. The Scheme enjoins that after a certain period, all tariffs and other barriers impeding free flow of trade, should be dismantled by member States. It is lamentable that several years after the implementation of the decision, nothing practical has taken place. It is in an effort to break this deadlock that the Secretariat sent some missions to member States to ascertain the problems and difficulties that have prevented them from implementing the scheme. The results of missions have been very revealing and on the basis of that, the Executive Secretariat has put up a number of possible recommendations for your due consideration and approval. I am convinced that when the time comes for us to deliberate on this important issue, Council will bring its collective wisdom to bear on this so that whatever decisions were taken will have a salutary effect on the implementation of this scheme.

Honourable Ministers,

Regarding the implementation of the Protocol on Free Movement of Persons, Right of Residence and Establishment, the report gathered from member States indicates that member States have not faired better in the implementation of this Protocol. There are instances here and there of violations by some member States of some aspects of its provisions. We still witness at our numerous border-posts and exit points of our highways, continuous harassment of Community citizens by our security agencies. A member State still demands visas from ECOWAS citizens visiting that country while at most of our border posts, prolonged searches and illegal levies and taxes are imposed on citizens in transit. Passengers and their vehicles are delayed for days and sometimes weeks before they pass through our territories. You can see with me, Honourable Ministers, that these acts are indeed against the spirit and letter of the Protocol.

Dear Colleagues,

I am glad that I am at least able to report to you that satisfactory progress has been recorded in the construction of the headquarters of our Community institutions. The construction of civil works on the Fund's headquarters in Lome has exceeded 70% while in the case of the Executive Secretariat headquarters in Abuja, Nigeria, work on the foundation works is going on. However, I am made to know that as the ECOWAS Fund's own financial obligation towards the construction is getting exhausted, member States have not been forthcoming in the payment of their own allocations. Records available to the Secretariat indicate that as of now only three of our members paid part of their 1987 allocation while only one member paid her 1987 allocation in full and made part payment of her 1988 allocation. The same deplorable picture is repeated in the case of the payment of our contributions to the annual budget of the Executive Secretariat.

Honourable Ministers, Distinguished Delegates,

Permit me to recall the appeal made by the Authority two years ago in Abuja that member States should liquidate their arrears up to 1983 by October 31, 1986 while the outstanding balance should be settled by March 31, 1987. It is saddening to learn that many member States have not responded to that appeal. There are many States whose arrears run into thousands of US dollars while some others are indebted to the tune of over one million US dollars. It is a fact that all our countries are facing severe economic crisis and balance of payments difficulties. Nevertheless, member States should show their level of commitment to our organization by making a conscious effort to reduce the quantum of arrears even if they cannot liquidate them at a time. I am therefore appealing to the Council in most passionate terms to try to find solutions to this magging problem as the Executive Secretariat can not be expected to function effectively if it has no funds with which to work.

Dear Colleagues,

We are being called upon during this session of Council to discuss a number of agenda items which will include, among others, the following:

The report of the Executive Secretary of ECOWAS.

The expiration of the term of the Executive Secretary, and that of the Managing Director of the ECOWAS Fund and the External Auditor.

The report of the Finance Experts Committee.

The report of the Transport, Telecommunications and Energy Commission.

The report of the Trade, Customs, Immigration, Money and Payments Commission, and

The report of the Industry, Agriculture and Natural Resources Commission.

Our agenda will also include the reports of the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee on the Construction of the Headquarters of ECOWAS institutions and the Board of Directors of ECOWAS Fund.

Finally, we will draw up agenda for the 11th Session of the Authority of Heads of State and Government.

Honourable Ministers, Distinguished Delegates, Ladies and Gentlemen,

I can only end this address by thanking all of you for the unflinching support you have given to my country, Nigeria, during her tenure of office as Chairman and I request you to continue to exhibit the same spirit of co-operation, solidarity and commitment to our organisation without which no meaningful progress can be achieved. ECOWAS, as the most viable economic grouping in the African continent has very bright prospects. With concerted efforts on our part and given the required political will, the lofty objectives which spurred the founding fathers of our organisation, will indeed be realised in a foreseeable future.
