- The forty-seventh session of the Council of Ministers was held at the Palais des Congrès in Bamako from 9-11 December 2000.

#### II. OPENING SESSION

- 7. Delivering his opening address, Mr. Bacary Koné, Minister of Economy and Finance of the Republic of Mali and Chairman of the Council of Ministers, on behalf of His Excellency, Alpha Oumar Konare, President of the Republic of Mali, and the government and people of Mali, welcomed the Honourable Ministers and their delegations to Bamako. The Minister noted that, unlike in the past, Member States had started demonstrating the much-needed political will, particularly in the wake of the ECOWAS/UEMOA ministerial meetings held in Bamako in January 2000. This had resulted in an acceleration in the integration process, as witnessed, among other things, by the establishment of an ECOWAS free trade zone, the decision to create a second monetary zone in ECOWAS by the year 2003, and the establishment of the remaining Community institutions. Mr. Bacary Kone noted that the establishment of the Community Parliament and the Court of Justice, centrepieces of the ECOWAS institutions, will not only enable the Community to act on the strong desire of our people to live in an ECOWAS where democracy, rule of law, peace and collective security reign, but also to protect the overall interests of the toiling masses.
- 8. The Minister noted that peace and security are indispensable to development and regional integration. On behalf of the government and people of Mali, he therefore urged all warring parties to lay down their arms so that peace would once again reign in our region.
- 9. Referring to the items on the agenda, the Minister stressed the importance of the memorandum on the status of the harmonisation of ECOWAS and UEMOA programmes. He expressed satisfaction at the progress achieved in the harmonisation of the programmes of the two organisations, particularly in the areas of the common market, the convergence of macro-economic policies, and the definition and implementation of sectoral policies.
- Concluding, the Minister expressed the hope that the twenty-fourth session of the Authority of Heads of State and Government to be held in Barnako would

take decisions that would give a new lease of life to our organisation, with a view to enabling it realise its objectives within the fixed time frame.

#### V. OUTCOME OF DELIBERATIONS

- <u>Item 4:</u> Presentation and consideration of the report of the Executive Secretary
- 13. The Executive Secretary, Mr. Lansana Kouyate, presented the year 2000 annual report entitled "Regional integration to ensure West African development in the new millennium". The report highlighted the poor economic results recorded in the region in 1999, noting that there was a general downturn in economic activity within ECOWAS, despite the favourable trend observed in

eight (8) of the countries. On the average, real GDP fell, going from 3.2% in 1998 to 2.7% in 1999. The declining economic growth rate in Cote d=lvoire and Nigeria, both of which represent 66% of the region=s GDP, and the civil conflicts in some of the countries, are some of the factors responsible for the fall in economic growth in the region. The report stressed, however, that the prospects for growth were quite bright because the Nigerian economy was expected to perform better and also because of the economic reforms going on in most of the other countries.

- 14. Under the chapter on the implementation of the Community work programme, the Executive Secretary reviewed the progress achieved since the last session of Council in Lome, in December 1999. He reviewed the status of implementation of the decisions and the directives of the session of the Authority of Heads of State and Government which took place in Lome on 9 December 1999 as well as the directives issued by the ECOWAS/UEMOA ministerial meetings held in Bamako on 28 and 29 January 2000 on the acceleration of the regional integration process. The Executive Secretary went over the actions that had been taken to harmonise the ECOWAS/UEMOA integration programmes, and the progress made toward the establishment of the second ECOWAS monetary zone and the creation of a borderless West Africa.
- The Executive Secretary also touched on other socio-economic programmes being implemented by ECOWAS, particularly the introduction of an ECOWAS passport and the implementation of sectoral programmes in the areas of transport, telecommunications, energy, the environment, education, health, and information. He also informed the Council of Ministers of the selection of candidates for the statutory posts and recalled the particularly difficult financial situation of the Executive Secretariat. He urged all the Member States which were yet to do so, to pay up their arrears of contributions and to implement all the provisions of the Protocol relating to the Community levy.
- 16. On the issue of regional peace and security, the Executive Secretary briefly reviewed the situation in Côte d'Ivoire, Guinea Bissau, and Sierra Leone, highlighting the tension at the borders between Guinea, Sierra Leone and

Liberia. He also detailed the actions that had been taken to implement the Mechanism on conflict prevention, management and resolution; peacekeeping and security.

- 17. Under institutional matters, the Executive Secretary reminded Council of the letter from the Islamic Republic of Mauritania notifying him of its decision to withdraw from ECOWAS. He had drawn the attention of Mauritania to the provisions of Article 91 of the revised Treaty setting out conditions for withdrawing from the Community, and ,more particularly, the provision that the country should discharge its obligations to the Community.
- 18. The Executive Secretary also informed Council that fourteen (14) personalities had been shortlisted and recommended to the Authority which will appoint seven (7) of them as judges of the Community Court of Justice. He also announced that the inaugural session of the Community Parliament had taken place in Bamako on 16 October 2000.
- 19. Recalling the need to strengthen ECOWAS in order to accelerate the development process in West Africa, the Executive Secretary stressed that it was essential to accord priority to the regional approach by ensuring that all Member States effectively implement all Community Protocols and decisions, and by creating an environment conducive to regional integration.
- 20. The Executive Secretary concluded his report by stressing the need for Member States to make every effort to support the newly-adopted fast-track approach to regional integration in West Africa.
- 21. Council congratulated the Executive Secretary on the quality of his report. Following discussions on the issues raised therein, Council adopted the report and made the following observations and recommendations:

#### (a) Economic situation

- in 1999 but noted that the medium-term prospects could be brighter, provided that economic reforms are implemented, and ECOWAS Member States have access to the benefits under the Enhanced Highly Indebted Poor Countries Initiative (EHIPC). Council also recognised the importance of peace, security and stability in the region to the promotion of development and integration of West African economies;
- ii) Council took due note of the information provided by the Head of the delegation from Sierra Leone to the effect that the macro-economic situation in her country has improved, due to prospects for greater security in the country.

# (b) Implementation of priority Community programmes

- Council stressed the need to enhance the capacity of the Executive Secretariat so as to enable it implement the Community priority programmes. To this end, the Executive Secretary should expedite action on the restructuring of the Executive Secretariat;
- ii) In order to accelerate the establishment of a single monetary zone, Council urged the Member States involved in the second monetary zone to redouble their efforts to ensure convergence of their macro-economic policies, with a view to facilitating the merger with the CFA monetary zone in 2004;
- iii) Council called on the ECOWAS Executive Secretary and the Chairman of the UEMOA Commission to pursue their consultations, with a view to harmonising the integration shemes of the two institutions, and to submit the legal texts on the harmonised programmes to their respective decision-making authorities for consideration as soon as possible;
- iv) Council requested the Executive Secretariat to include the implementation of the Protocol on the Community levy on the list of its priorities. It also

requested the Secretariat to undertake technical fact-finding missions to Member States and to present a detailed report at each session of Council on the status of application of the protocol, the problems encountered and the solutions proposed.

# <u>Item 5</u>: Consideration of the memorandum on the acceleration of the regional integration process

- 22. The Executive Secretary presented the memorandum defining modalities for implementing the strategy for accelerating the regional integration process in West Africa, with a view to creating a single economic zone by September 2001. The memorandum recommended that, as a prelude to the signing of the Regional Economic Partnership Agreements (REPA) within the framework of the new ACP/European Union Convention, a customs union should be established as soon as possible, based on the lowest customs tariffs in the region.
- 23. After discussions, Council requested the Executive Secretariat to draw on the UEMOA experience in establishing a common external tariff, and to undertake without delay studies on the potential impact of the adoption of the tariff on the public finance and economies of all ECOWAS countries. Council also called on development partners, particularly the IMF, the World Bank, and the European Union, to provide the assistance needed to carry out the studies and to bear the costs of any budgetary and economic adjustments that may be necessary. The conclusions of the studies should be submitted to the Trade Commission which will make recommendations to the Council of Ministers.
- 24. Council requested the Executive Secretariat to explore the possibility of all ECOWAS Member States benefiting from the use of the Solidarity fund established from the balance of proceeds of the Community levy of the seven countries in the ECOWAS borderless zone scheme. This could be used to pay compensation for loss of customs revenue incurred through application of the trade liberalisation scheme.
- 25. Council discussed extensively the problems hindering free movement of persons and goods in the region. Member States were requested to take appropriate

measures to remove all roadblocks along community highways in their territories.

Council also called on the Executive Secretariat project in order to provide more support to the promoters of the ECOAIR project towards the establishment of the airline.

- 26. Council requested the Executive Secretariat to urgently convene a meeting of Ministers of Transport and Civil Aviation to consider the practical modalities of implementing the Yamoussoukro Agreement on the liberalisation of traffic rights.
- 27. With regard to participation by ECOWAS and UEMOA in international meetings, Council requested the decision-making authorities of the two organisations to adopt a common position through a system of permanent consultation so as to be able to speak with one voice at international fora.

# <u>Item 6 (i)</u>: Consideration of report of the Acting Managing Director of the ECOWAS Fund

- 28. The Acting Managing Director of ECOWAS Fund presented his report on :
  - Meetings of the Board of Directors
  - Transformation of the Fund
  - Balance sheet of operational activities
- 29. The Acting Managing Director presented the reports of these meetings which focused on the use of the Community Levy, the Fund's participation in the HIPC initiative, the loans cancellation policy in order to improve upon the Fund's loans portfolio and approved a budget of US\$ 111 811 for the Special Fund for Telecommunications restructuring study.
- 30. As concerns transformation of the Fund, the Managing Director reported on the deliberations of the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee which held its 16th meeting on 30 and 31 October, 2000 and its 17th meeting on 10 December, 2000 to consider the progress of the Fund's transformation exercise and the basic legal documents.

- 31. The balance sheet of operational activities revealed that the project identification activities were undertaken in Ghana and Benin. Six (6) projects were appraised. Two (2) loan agreements were signed with Cape Verde and Guinea. Two (2) project start up missions were also undertaken to Benin and Nigeria. Supervision missions were undertaken in connection with four (4) projects (Benin, Côte d'Ivoire, Mali and Nigeria).
- 32. As at 30 September 2000, the Fund's portfolio comprised 40 agreements for an amount of UA 80,469,942 as against UA 78,310,942 as at 30 September 1999. Disbursements stood at UA 56,833,689 compared with UA 52,663,118 as at 30 September 1999.
- 33. With regard to the recovery of loans, out of an amount of UA 61,025,823 which fell due as at 30 September 2000, an amount of UA 55,742,283 was repaid, bringing the loan recovery rate to 91.3%.
- 34. With regard to co-operation and resource mobilisation activities, a loan agreement in respect of 8 million euros was signed with Crédit Commercial de France while some other activities being undertaken with Citibank, EIB, USAID and some other American banks are in progress.
- 35. Concerning financial performance, as at 30 September 2000, the rate of income execution stood at 64%, representing an amount of UA 2,280,732 whilst the rate of execution of expenditure stood at 59%, representing an amount of UA 2,065,440. This reflects a surplus of income over expenditure of UA 215,292 during the period as against a budgetary surplus of UA 371 841 as at 30 September 1999.
- 36. The operating results decreased by 43.09% from UA 223 256 to UA 127 062 between 30 September 1999 and 30 September 2000, partly due to the reduction in certain income items and partly to an increase in operating costs.
- The cash flow situation of the Fund fell by 5% between 30 September 1999 andSeptember 2000 due to disbursements in respect of loans and the non-

payment of sums owed by some member States. Member States still owe the Fund an amount of UA 13,986,066 in respect of the first and second tranches of called-up capital and UA 3 590 418 in respect of the construction of the headquarters buildings.

- 38. The Acting Managing Director felt that all in all the Fund=s financial situation had been improving since the beginning of restructuring in 1998, yet it still remained fragile and needed a boost.
- 39. Finally, the Acting Managing Director expressed his wish that Member States support the efforts by fulfilling their obligations to the Fund in order to improve its image abroad now that the Fund is being transformed into the ECOWAS Investment and Development Bank.
- 40. The Council of Ministers studied and discussed the annual report of the Acting Managing Director and took note of it.
- Item 7 (i): REPORT OF THE AD HOC MINISTERIAL COMMITTEE ON THE ENHANCEMENT OF THE FINANCIAL RESOURCES OF THE ECOWAS FUND
- 41. The Chairman of the Ad hoc Ministerial Committee, presented the report of the deliberations of the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> sessions of the Committee. He gave a status report on the transformation and expressed Council's concern over the delays in determining the Funds value.
- 42. He concluded by requesting that Council adopt the request and proposed that the Authority approve and ratify the following:
  - the draft additional protocol amending Articles 1, 6 and 21 of the Revised Treaty:
  - the draft Protocol relating to the EBID;
  - the draft decision completing Decision A/DEC.4/12/99 transforming the Fund, which relates to the method of management during the transitional period.

Item 7 [iii]: Report of the Ad Hoc Ministerial Committee on Construction of Headquarters of Community Institutions

- 45. The report presented by the Chairman of the Committee indicates that 98% of the ECOWAS Executive Secretariat staff quarters in Abuja have been completed. However, construction works have been suspended due mainly to the non-provision of services on the site and the semi-collective facilities to be provided by the Nigerian Government. Besides, the Committee observed that there were a number of lapses in the project design and underscored the need for additional works in order to make the site habitable.
- 46. Council stressed that it was of the utmost importance that both the first set of additional works identified by the Executive Secretariat, which is to be executed at the cost of UA 1 027 266.84, and the second set of additional works, which were added by the ad hoc ministerial Committee ,and which are estimated to cost \$2 524 971.59. The total amount of funding to be sought therefore comes to US\$3 552 238.43. This amount cannot be raised through contributions from Member States in view of the fact that most of them are already in arrears of contribution to the budgets of the Secretariat.
- 47. Similarly, the ECOWAS Fund cannot be requested to provide the funds because of the restructuring currently going on in that institution.
- 48. Consequently, Council recommended that the Authority of Heads of State and Government should make a special request to the Federal Government of Nigeria to consider covering the cost of these additional works or to grant another loan of US\$ 3,552,238.43 to Member States for the additional works.

# Item 7 (iv): Status Report on the Harmonisation of ECOWAS and UEMOA Programmes

49. This item having already been discussed in paragraph 21(iii), Council took note of the memorandum presented by the Executive Secretariat.

# Item 7(v): Consideration of the Report of the meeting of the Committee of Governors

50. The Governor of the Central Bank of the Gambia presented this report in his capacity as the chairman of the Committee. He gave a situation report setting out the actions that had been taken in respect of the monetary cooperation programme and the circulation of the ECOWAS travellers cheques.

# Monetary cooperation programme

- 51. The situation as regards Member States= compliance with the convergence criteria is as follows:
  - Primary criteria (operational)
  - i) Budget deficit / GDP ratio (minus grants): equal to or less than 4% by 2002.
    - Four (4) countries have complied with this criterion.
  - ii) inflation rate: equal to or less than 5%.
    - Beven countries have complied with this criterion.
  - iii) Central Bank financing of budget deficit: equal to or less than 10% of previous year's tax revenue.
    - Seven (7) countries have complied with this criterion.

- iv) Gross external reserves: equal to or greater than 6 months of imports by 2003.
  - Three (3) countries have complied with this criterion.
- Secondary criteria (analytical)
- i) Tax Receipts / GDP ratio: equal to or greater than 20%
  - Three (3) countries have complied with this criterion.
- ii) Salary Mass / Total Tax Receipts: equal to or less than 35%
  - Ten (10) countries have complied with this criterion.
- iii) Investments financed from internal sources / Tax Receipts equal to or above 20%
  - Six (6) countries have complied with this criterion.
- iv) Positive real interest rates
  - Twelve (12) countries have complied with this criterion
- 52. The Chairman of the Committee of Governors of Central Banks informed Council that in the absence of necessary data, it had not been possible to calculate the exact amount owed as internal and external arrears, and real exchange rate stability, respectively.
- 53. In order to accelerate the implementation of the Monetary Cooperation Programme, the Committee of Governors of Central Banks recommended that Member States should, among other things, liberalise their current and capital accounts. They should also convey the composition of their National

Coordination Committees to WAMA and ECOWAS Executive Secretariat before the end of 2000. The Governors further recommended that an ECOWAS Exchange Rate Mechanism should be adopted, which would allow their exchange rate to fluctuate within the band of plus or minus 5%.

- 54. With regard to the Second ECOWAS Monetary Zone expected to take off in 2003, the Committee of Governors stressed the need for synergy between the unit and the UEMOA Monetary Zone. To this end, the Committee of Governors requested the ECOWAS Executive Secretariat, WAMA, BCEAO and UEMOA to work closely towards harmonising their programmes.
- 55. Council adopted the recommendations of the Committee of Governors on the ECOWAS Monetary Programme and requested WAMA and the ECOWAS Executive Secretariat to update the macro-economic data that had been used to evaluate the convergence criteria in the report of the Committee of Governors and the annual report of the Executive Secretary. Council also stressed the need to expedite action to complete the studies on the harmonisation of the legal and statistical framework of public finance, national accounts, and consumer prices, with a view to facilitating comparability of the data used in the evaluation of the criteria.

# **ECOWAS Travellers Cheques**

- 56. The Chairman of the Committee of Governors informed Council that since they were put into circulation, the ECOWAS travellers cheques have not been performing satisfactorily, due to problems such as the low volume of the cheques in circulation, insufficient awareness on the part of economic operators and the public, and difficulties related to payment and settlement. It was noted that as at the end of October 2000, only 2.3 million WAUA worth of travellers cheques had been sold, cashed and settled.
- 57. In order to make the cheques fully operational, the Committee of Governors requested Member States to renew their commitment to the use of this important regional payment instrument. The Committee of Governors also recommended

that a ceiling be fixed for the amount that could be bought so as to limit speculation. WAMA was also requested to carry out a study on the possibility of transferring the management of the travellers cheques to the private sector.

58. Council approved the recommendations of the Committee of Governors.

# Item 7(vi): Industry, Science, Technology and Energy Commission

## **Meeting of Energy Ministers**

- 59. The report of the second meeting of Ministers of Energy, held in Lomé on 29 September, 2000, was presented by its Chairman. It dwelt mainly on the establishment of the implementation organs of the West African Power Pool (WAPP).
- 60. Council approved the recommendations of the ministerial meeting, notably those relating to the establishment of the implementation organs of the pool, for which purpose the Member States have been divided into two zones as follows:

Zone A: Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Niger, Nigeria and Togo

Zone B: The Gambia, Guinea-Bissau, Guinea, Liberia, Mali, Mauritania, Senegal and Sierra Leone.

- 61. Council also approved the establishment of two working groups for each zone:
  - one working group for technical aspects;
  - one working group for institutional aspects.
- 62. In addition, Council approved in principle the appointment of a chairman for the Steering Committee, and a chairman for the implementation committee in each zone, on a rotational basis for a period of one year. It also approved the appointment of group leaders as follows:

Zone A: Côte d'Ivoire for technical aspects

Nigeria for institutional aspects.

Zone B: Guinea for technical aspects

Senegal for institutional aspects.

- Council recommended that a special energy programme be designed for Cape Verde since this country cannot be covered in the interconnection of electricity grids envisaged by ECOWAS on account of its geographical location.
- 64. Council further recommended that, in future, the sectoral ministers should set out the economic and financial implications of any decisions they take at their meetings.
- 65. Council expressed its gratitude to the World Bank Group and USAID for their assistance to the ECOWAS Executive Secretariat and Member States towards the implementation of the Community energy programme.

Item 7 (vii): Human Resources, Information, Social and Cultural Affairs

Commission

## Meeting of Ministers of Information and Communication

- 66. After presentation of the report of the meeting of Ministers of Information\_and Communication, held in Barnako on 2 and 3 October, 2000, Council approved the recommendations contained therein and adopted the new Community Information and Communication Policy focused mainly on the following issues:
  - i) Establishment of ECOWAS information centres in each Member State;
  - ii) Establishment of an ECOWAS radio/television station;
  - iii) Training of journalists in economic integration, peacekeeping and new technologies;
  - iv) Co-production and exchange of programmes between the sub-region's media;

67. Council requested the Executive Secretariat, given the current budgetary constraints, to keep the cost of the programme within the limits of available financial resources. Council also requested the Secretariat to determine those areas of the programme that should be accorded priority and which would require short term financing, and map out an effective strategy that private sector's contribution to promoting the regional development and integration efforts.

## Ministerial meeting on Laundering of Drug Money

- 68. The report of the first ministerial meeting on money laundering in West Africa held in Dakar on 3 November 2000 was presented by the Senegalese Minister for African Integration. The Inter-governmental Action Group against MoneyLlaundering (GIABA) was established by Decision A/EC.9/12/99 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government for the purpose of promoting strategies to combat money laundering in Africa. Its objectives are:
  - to protect financial and banking systems as well as the economies of
     Member States against crime money;
  - to ensure that appropriate measures are taken to combat money laundering in a harmonised and concerted manner;
  - to facilitate the implementation by its members of the plan of action against money laundering adopted by the United nations General Assembly in New York on 10 June 1998; the forty recommendations enacted by the financial action group (FATF), and international conventions and treaties on the matter;
  - to strengthen international cooperation among its members
  - to evaluate progress and the efficacy of measures being taken to combat
     laundering of money generate from crime.

legal advisors to make sure that they were in line with existing ECOWAS texts:

- Where deemed necessary, technical committees would be created for the proper functioning of WAHO;
- iii) The WAHO structure should include a Legal Unit, although this would not be operational immediately. A Traditional Medicine Unit was also created;
- iv) WAHO should manage the arrears due on Member State contributions to OCCGE after the 31 December 2000, so that the debts are paid up to the Organisation for the Coordination and Cooperation of Major Endemic Diseases;
- v) qualified and competent Senior WAHC and OCCGE staff who have the necessary qualifications should be given priority when recruiting WAHO senior staff;
- vi) The revised list of WAHO priority programmes was adopted;
- vii) The Organisation's budget for 2001 was adopted and came to UA 3,182,940. Out of this amount UA 1,595,998 will be funded by the Community Levy, and UA 1,586,942 from external resources;
- viii) All WAHO Departments should be located at the headquarters in Bobo-Dioulasso.
- ix) The draft resolution on HIV/AIDS in West Africa "Control Strategy" was approved.
- x) Efforts should be coordinated to ensure that anti-retroviral drugs are affordable and readily available for HIV/AIDS treatment.
- xi) The recommendations of the sub-regional workshop on HIV vaccine were adopted.

72. The Report of the Seventh the Session of the Conference of Ministers of Youth and Sports (CMYS), which was held from 31st August to 1<sup>st</sup> September 2000 at Ouagadougou, was presented by its Chairman. The Council approved the Conference of Ministers' recommendation that the CMYS/ECOWAS be elevated to a specialised institution of ECOWAS, and for its allocation to be raised from UA 5,000 to 10,000.

# Second meeting of the Forum of Associations recognised by ECOWAS (FARE)

- 73. In its desire to establish a mechanism to co-ordinate the activities of NGOs, and provide a link between the recognised associations and the Executive Secretariat, the Council of Ministers approved, via Regulation C/REG.5/11/96, the creation of the Forum of Associations recognised by ECOWAS.
- 74. The Forum hopes to serve as a focal point to formulate recommendations and viewpoints on actions for submission to the Council of Ministers through the Executive Secretariat.
- A FARE meeting held in Abuja from 26 to 28 September, 2000 afforded the NGOs the opportunity to reaffirm their resolve to contribute their quota to accelerate the integration process.
- 76. The Council of Ministers took note of the conclusions and recommendations of the Forum and directed the Secretariat to assist it as much as possible.

## Item 7(viii) Environment and Water Resources Commission

#### Meeting of Ministers of Water Resources

77. The integrated management of water resources is an item on the agenda of the Summit. Consequently, Council decided to transfer the matter to the Authority of Heads of State and Government.

# Item 7 (ix): Trade, Customs, Taxation, Statistics, Money and Payments Commission

- 78. The report of the Commission meeting held in Barnako from 27 to 30 November, 2000, which was presented by the Chairman for the occasion, concerned mainly:
  - i) proposed new industrial products and enterprises for approval to benefit from the ECOWAS Trade Liberalisation Scheme:
  - ii) the compensation budget for loss of revenue;
  - iii) processing of applications for transfer of approval;
  - iv) reports of the ECOWAS/UEMOA consultative meetings on the harmonisation of their trade liberalisation schemes;
  - v) status report on the fast-track approach to integration in West Africa;
  - vi) report of the first meeting of the Higher Committee on Land Transport;
  - vii) status report on the preparation of the Third ECOWAS Trade Fair.
  - viii) report of the meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee on Travel and Tourism facilitation;
  - ix) applications for observer status submitted by the following organisations:

    African Business Round Table and World Trade Centres Association.
- 79. After its deliberations, Council approved the draft regulation, hereto attached, on the list of approved industrial products and enterprises. Council approved the compensation budget for loss of revenue incurred by the Republic of Benin in 1999, amounting to one hundred and seventy million, three hundred and fortytwo thousand one hundred francs CFA (FCFA 170.342.100).
- 80. With regard to applications for transfer of approval, Council mandated the Executive Secretariat to process such applications and take the necessary decision. It shall however inform Member States of its decision and report to the relevant Commission. The draft Regulation is attached as an annex.
- 81. In the area of trade liberalisation, Council approved the Commission's recommendations on the harmonisation of the rules of origin, approval

procedures and the ECOWAS and UEMOA compensation procedures for loss of revenue. Consequently, Council decided:

- to harmonise the ECOWAS and UEMOA deadlines for compensation;
- to harmonise the rates of Community levy;
- to increase the deadline for payment of compensation from 3 months to
   6 months, in view of the peculiar situation of ECOWAS;
- to appeal to UEMOA to take measures to ensure the adoption and application of the single Customs Declaration (SCD) which it helped to prepare;
- 82. Council urged the Executive Secretary to prepare the legal documents on the proposed harmonisation exercise and submit them for a decision to the next statutory meetings coming up in May, 2001.
- 83. Council urged the Executive Secretariat to continue organising enlightenment campaigns for customs officials and economic operators on the trade liberalisation schemes, and to submit to each session, a report on the scheme, the measures taken by Member States to implement it, and the difficulties encountered by economic operators.
- 84. Council took note of the activities carried out within the framework of the fasttrack approach to integration in West Africa, and called on all Member States to
  do everything possible to implement the decisions on free movement of persons
  and the free trade zone. It directed the Secretariat to initiate the necessary
  consultations for the establishment of tariff regime applicable to products
  manufactured in export processing zones and to submit a report to the
  appropriate Commission for consideration.
- 85. Council took note of the report of the 11th meeting of the Higher Committee on Land Transport and proposed that it be submitted to sectoral experts for consideration before the Commission makes recommendations to the Council of Ministers.
- 86. Council adopted a draft regulation relating to the organisation of the Third ECOWAS Trade Fair in Lome, Togolese Republic. The draft regulation concerns

- the selection of Lome (Togo) to host the third trade fair, and the setting up of a regional organising committee and an ad hoc monitoring committee.
- 87. Considering the importance and the complex nature of the issue relating to travel and tourism facilitation, Council directed the Executive Secretariat to refer the matter to a meeting of tourism and security issues for consideration.
- 88. With regard to the applications for observer status submitted by organisations, Council decided to grant the African Business Round Table (ABR) and the World Trade Centres Association observer status within ECOWAS.

# Item 7(x): ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE COMMISSION

- 89. The report of the Administration and Finance Commission held in Barnako from2 to 8 December and presented by its chairman focused on the following points;
  - Status of implementation of tasks assigned to the Executive Secretariat;
  - Status of financial contributions of Member States.
  - compensation budget for loss of revenue;
  - strategies for resolving the problem of quorum at ECOWAS statutory meetings;
  - status of ratification of the revised treaty, protocols and conventions
  - report of the Executive Secretariat's Internal Auditor;
  - report of the External auditor;
  - upward review of the education grant;
  - participation by the Executive Secretariat in the National Youth Service
     Corps scheme of the Federal Republic of Nigeria;
  - proposals for a permanent solution to the problem of residential
     accommodation for locally recruited staff;
  - financial implications of the new information and communication policy;
  - draft 2001 budget.

- 90. Council made the following observations and recommendations:
  - On the item of the agenda relating to tasks assigned to the Executive Secretariat, Council endorsed the observations and recommendations of the Commission, particularly those concerning the speedy implementation of ECOWAS priority programmes. In the future, the Executive Secretariat should present the outcome of the task assigned to the decision making body concerned and submit a report to Council.
  - contributions which came to UA 32,769,700.52. It congratulated the countries who had no arrears on the contributions, i.e. Benin, Mali and Togo, and those countries whose arrears were only for the year 2000, such as Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, and Nigeria. Council commended Senegal for the efforts it had made to pay up the arrears of its contributions.
  - iii) As for those countries owing large sums, the Council invited them to pay up as soon as possible. Furthermore, the Council requested that the Executive Secretariat send missions to Member States to ensure that the Community Levy becomes operational as quickly as possible. The Secretariat should also prepare a detailed report for the Council and the Authority, on the application of the Levy, problems encountered and possible solutions.
  - iv) As concerns the problem of a quorum during statutory meetings, the Council invited the Secretariat to prepare a detailed report on income made from the Community Levy before taking any decision.
  - v) Furthermore, to ensure effective participation of Member States, ECOWAS should endeavour to send invitations and working documents at least 15 days before the meeting and to inform Members of the dates of meetings at the beginning of each year.
  - vi) On the issue of ratidfication of the revised Treaty, protocols and conventions, Council called on the Member States concerned to take the necessary measures to ratify all protocols and conventions immediately.

- vii) With regard to the report of the Internal Auditor, Council requested the Executive Secretariat to strictly implement the provisions of the Financial Regulations and Manual of Accounting Procedure and to remain within the limit of the budget. The Executive Secretariat should submit a detailed account of amounts received in the form of external aid, indicating the amounts committed. Council also requested the Executive Secretariat to review the Financial Regulations and Manual of Accounting Procedure and propose measures to strengthen internal controls within the Instituion.
- viii) Council approved the audited 1998 accounts of the Executive Secretariat.
- ix) Council also adopted the following new rates of education grant payable to members of staff for their dependent children:
  - statutory and professional staff: 2,000 dollars per year for each child;
  - locally recruited staff (General Services and Auxiliary Staff): 400
     dollars per year for each child.
- Youth Service Corps programme of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Council agreed that the programme was capable of playing a useful role in the civic training of young school leavers. Council approved the payment of 10,000 naira per month to each corps member posted to the Executive Secretariat, and requested the Executive Secretariat to look into the possibility of extending the programme to young school leavers from other Member States.
- xi) Concerning the proposal to find a permanent solution to the problem of providing residential accommodation for locally recruited staff, Council approved the recruitment of a Consultant to carry out a feasibility study and submit an estimate of the cost of the construction.
- xii) Council also approved a budget for the Executive Secretariat balanced in income and expenditure at UA14,906,506. The amount of UA12,696,900 is expected as contributions for Member States. UA2,000,000 will be

derived from Member States' arrears of contributions while UA 210,000 is expected as miscellaneous income.

xiii) The Secretariat informed Council of the session of the Community Parliament scheduled for end January 2001 in Abuja. The session will adopt the rules of procedure of the Parliament and the draft budget which should be incorporated into Community budget.

Adoption of the draft Agenda of the Twenty-fourth session of the Authority of Heads of State and Government

91. Council adopted the draft Agenda of the Twenty-fourth session of the Authority of Heads of State and Government attached as an annex.

ITEM 9: Any other business

92. No issue was raised under this item.

ITEM 10: Adoption of Report

93. This report was adopted.

ITEM II: Closing Session

94. In his closing speech, Mr. Bacari Kone, Minister of Finance and the Economy of the Republic of Mali, Chairman of the Council of Ministers, thanked members of Council for actively participating in the deliberations. He stressed the need for all Member States to demonstrate greater political commitment by supporting ECOWAS activities. He appealed to Member States to honour the commitments they entered into during this session, with a view to strengthening the regional integration process.

The organs set out in Article 1 of this Regulation shall operate according to the following zones into which Member States are divided:

Zone A: Bénin, Burkina, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Niger, Nigeria and Togo

**Zone B**: Guinea Bissau, Malí, Mauritania, Senegal, The Gambia, Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone.

#### Article 3

Each zone shall be managed by an implementation sub-committee and two working groups.

#### Article 4

Nigeria and Côte d'Ivoire shall be respectively responsible for coordinating the institutional and technical aspects of Zone A's activities.

#### Article 5

Guinea and Senegal shall be respectively responsible for coordinating the institutional and technical aspects of Zone B's activities.

#### Article 6

Each meeting of the Steering Committee and Implementation Committee shall be chaired by the host country.

#### Article 7

ECOWAS Executive Secretariat shall act as the Permanent Secretariat of the implementation organs.

#### Article 9

This regulation shall be published by the Executive Secretariat in the Official Journal of the Community within thirty (30) days of its signature by the Chairman of the Council of Ministers. It shall also be published within the same time frame by each Member State in its National Gazette.

# REGULATION C/REG.9/12/00 ESTABLISHING THE PROCEDURE FOR TRANSFER OF APPROVAL GIVEN TO INDUSTRIAL ENTERPRISES AND PRODUCTS PURSUANT TO A CHANGE OF COMPANY NAME

#### THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS,

**MINDFUL** of Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the revised ECOWAS Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

MINDFUL of Decisions C/DEC.3/6/88 and C/DEC.4/7/92 of the Council of Ministers dated 21 June 1988 and 25 July 1992 respectively, establishing the procedure for granting approval to industrial enterprises and products to benefit from the ECOWAS trade liberalisation scheme;

**NOTING** that industrial mergers are becoming increasingly frequent in Member States;

**DESIRING** to promote intra-Community trade through speedy and effective trade liberalisation within ECOWAS;

**AWARE** of the need to process applications for transfer of approval under the trade liberalisation scheme as quickly as possible;

ON THE RECOMMENDATION of the forty-first meeting of Trade, Customs, Immigration, Money and Payments Commission held in Bamako from 27 to 30 November 2000.

#### ENACTS

#### I. CONDITIONS GOVERNING TRANSFER OF APPROVAL

#### Artide 1

The procedure for processing applications for transfer of approval following a change in company name occasioned by a company acquisition or a company merger, shall be as set out in the articles hereunder.

#### Artide 2

An enterprise which, for any of the reasons enumerated in Article 1 above, applies for a transfer of approval:

- must be registered in a Member State;
- ii) must manufacture the same types of goods for which the initial approval was granted; that is to say the products must have the same characteristics, and the goods must still meet the Community origin criteria. The packaging of the goods may however be different.

An enterprise which does not satisfy the above conditions must submit a fresh application.

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#### II. PROCEDURE

#### Artide 3

All applications from the companies or enterprises requesting a transfer of approval shall be sent to the relevant authority in the Member State where they shall be screened before being forwarded to the ECOWAS Executive Secretariat.

Such applications must be channelled through the ministry in charge of ECOWAS affairs.

#### Article 4

The ECOWAS Executive Secretariat shall consider such applications received, and shall grant the transfer of approval where such applications satisfy the conditions set out in Articles 1 and 2 above. It shall duly notify all Member States as well as the enterprises concerned of its decision.

#### III. DOCUMENTATION

#### Article 5

Applications for a transfer of approval must include the following documents:

- i) a formal request from the enterprise applying for the transfer of approval, stating the reasons for the application and including the following information:
  - the identity of the enterprise (the company name, the nature of its activities, its location and its headquarters);

- the product name identity and a description of the manufacturing process;
- the quantity and value of the raw materials used and the value-added of the manufactured product
- a deed of transfer or merger issued by the competent authority of the country in which the enterprise is located;
- iii) an attestation of registration in the trade register.

#### IV. PUBLICATION

#### Article 6

This Regulation shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community by the Executive Secretariat within thirty (30) days of its signature by the Chairman of Council. It shall also be published by each Member State in its National Gazette within the same time-frame.

### REGULATION C/REG.10/00 RELATING TO THE ORGANISATION OF THE THIRD ECOWAS TRADE FAIR

#### THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS,

**MINDFUL** of Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the Revised Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

**MINDFUL** of Decision C/DEC.5/5/82 dated 26 May 1982 of the Council of Ministers relating to the programming of trade fairs;

**MINDFUL** of Decision C/DEC.7/7/85 dated 3 July 1985 of the Council of Ministers establishing a Consultation and Coordination Committee for the programming of trade fairs and similar commercial events in ECOWAS Member States;

**CONSCIOUS** of the importance of trade fairs and exhibitions in the development of trade between Member States of the Community;

ON THE RECOMMENDATION of the Trade, Customs, Immigration, Money and Payments Commission which met in Bamako from 27 to 30 November 2000

#### **ENACTS**

#### Article 1

The Togolese Republic is hereby selected to host the Third ECOWAS Trade Fair.

#### Article 2

The Third ECOWAS Trade Fair shall be held from 7 to 16 March 2003.

The fair shall be multi-sectoral in concept with priority given to professional meetings and organisation of buyers/sellers meetings.

#### Article 3

There is hereby established a Regional Organising Committee which shall be responsible for the organisation of the Third ECOWAS Trade Fair.

The Regional Organising Committee is constituted as follows:

- one representative from each of the Member States having permanent trade fair facilities: Burkina Faso, Ghana, Nigeria, Senegal and Togo;
- one representative from the Federation of West African
   Manufacturers Association;
- one representative from the Federation of West African
   Chambers of Commerce;

- one representative from the West African Women's Association;
- one representative of the ECOWAS Executive Secretariat
   and one representative of the ECOWAS Fund.

#### Article 4

The Regional Organising Committee of the Third ECOWAS Trade Fair shall:

- (i) supervise all activities relating to the preparation and organisation of the fair;
- (ii) assist the Executive Secretariat in all measures taken by the latter in this regard.

#### Article 5

There is hereby established within the Regional Organising Committee an Ad Hoc Monitoring Committee which shall be made up of representatives from Ghana, Senegal, Togo, and the ECOWAS Executive Secretariat.

#### <u>Article 6</u>

The Ad Hoc Monitoring Committee shall be responsible for implementing the recommendations of the Regional Organising Committee. It shall report on its activities to that body.

#### Article 7

The activities of the two committees shall be funded from the budget of the Community.

#### Article 8

This Regulation shall be published by the Executive Secretariat in the Official Journal of the Community within thirty (30) days of its signature by the Chairman of the Council of Ministers. It shall also be published by each Member State in its National Gazette within the same time-frame.

# REGULATION C/REG.14/12/2000 APPROVING THE BUDGET OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARIAT FOR THE 2001 FINANCIAL YEAR

### THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS,

MINDFUL of Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the Revised Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

**MINDFUL** of the provisions of Article 69 of the Revised Treaty which relates to the budget of the Community;

**MINDFUL** of the Financial Regulations and Manual of Accounting Procedures of the Institutions of ECOWAS amended by Regulation C/REG.2/12/95:

**HAVING CONSIDERED** the budget proposed by the Twenty-fifth meeting of the Administration and Finance Commission held in Barnako, from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> December, 2000;

### ENACTS

### ARTICLE 1

The budget of the Executive Secretariat for the 2001 financial year, balanced in income and expenditure at the sum of Fourteen million, nine hundred and eleven thousand five hundred (14 911 500) Units of Accounts is hereby approved.

### ARTICLE 2

An amount of Twelve million, seven hundred and one thousand five hundred (12 701 500) Units of Accounts shall be derived from the annual contributions of Member States. A sum of Two millions (2 000 000) shall be obtained from arrears paid in respect of past budgets, and another sum of Two hundred and ten thousand (210 000) Unites of Accounts shall be derived from other sources.

### ARTICLE 3

This Regulation shall be published by the Executive Secretariat in the Official Journal of the Community within thirty (30) days of its signature by the Chairman of the Council of Ministers. It shall also be published by each Member State in its National Gazette within the same time-frame.

RESULT OF THE LIBERALISATION OF INTRA-ECOWAS TRADE

# THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS,

MINDFUL of Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the Revised Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

**MINDFUL** of Decision A/DEC.8/5/79 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government, dated 29 May 1979 relating to the consolidation of customs duties and taxes of equivalent effect, and non-tariff barriers;

MINDFUL of Decision A/DEC.19/5/80 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government, dated 28 May, 1980 relating to compensation procedure for loss of revenue suffered by ECOWAS Member States as a result of the liberalisation of intra-ECOWAS trade;

MINDFUL of Decision A/DEC.1/5/83 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government relating to the adoption and implementation of a single trade liberalisation scheme for industrial products originating from Member States, and the amendment thereto embodied in Decision A/DEC.6/6/89, dated 30 June, 1989;

The ECOWAS Executive Secretariat and the ECOWAS Fund shall be responsible for the payment to the Member State that has suffered the loss of revenue in the amounts recorded in the compensation budgets for 1999.

# Article 3

This Regulation shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community by the Executive Secretariat within thirty (30) days of its signature by the Chairman of the Council of Ministers. It shall also be published by each Member State in its National Gazette within the same time frame.

# REGULATION C/REG.16/12/00 ON THE ADOPTION OF EDUCATION GRANT FOR STAFF OF THE INSTITUTIONS OF THE COMMUNITY

# THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS,

**MINDFUL** of Articles 10, 11 and 12 of the Revised Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions;

**MINDFUL** of Article 26 of the ECOWAS Staff Regulations adopted by the Forty-fifth Session of the Council of Ministers held in Lomé from 5 to 7 December 1999 vide Regulation C/REG.4/12/99.

**CONSIDERING** that the professional staff of the ECOWAS Institutions had, by virtue of the Staff Regulations been receiving an education grant of one thousand (1000) United States Dollars;

**CONSIDERING** also that Decision C/DEC.1/11/89 of the Council of Ministers authorised a grant of 100 UA per annum for each dependent child of staff of G and M categories;

**CONSIDERING** also that the rates mentioned above are grossly insufficient and unrealistic considering the fact of inflation, constant increase of school fees and inability of staff members to adequately cope financially;

**DESIRING** to review upwards the education grant in order to ameliorate the financial difficulties of staff and provide children of the Community the highest standard of education;

ON THE RECOMMENDATION of the Twenty-fifth Meeting of the Administration and Finance Commission held in Bamako from 2 to 8 December 2000.

#### ENACTS

# Article 1

There shall be a maximum education grant of \$2000 (two thousand United States Dollars) and \$400 (four hundred United States Dollars) for each dependent child of internationally recruited staff and locally recruited staff respectively.

#### Article 2

The education grant shall be paid for each dependant child up to a maximum of 4 (four) children. The child must be in full time attendance at a school (kindergarten, secondary school), university or similar educational institution.

Reimbursement to staff shall be made upon presentation of receipts of payment for tuition fees and related charges. The phrase, "related charges" in this context, means other expenses related to the child's education, such as books, stationery, uniform, accommodation (boarding) fees.

# Article 4

The Executive Secretariat shall present a memorandum to the year 2002 budgetary session of the Administration and Finance Commission for its review of the amount of grant provided in this Regulation.

# Article 5

This Regulation shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community by the Executive Secretariat within thirty (30) days of its signature by the Chairman of Council. It shall also be published by each Member State in its National Gazette within the same time frame.
